During primary and secondary processing all CBP Officers must remember the following:

- CBP Officers must be diligent in verifying the proper class of admission and admit until date.
- It is imperative to ensure that all non-immigrant classifications entered into (b) (7)(E) (b) (7)(E) upon completion of an inspection reflect the actual class of admission.
- All primary and secondary inspection dispositions should be accurate and complete.
- Erroneous admission information will not only affect the reliability of CBP databases, but can adversely affect legitimate aliens when it comes to eligibility for benefits and/or future admissions into the United States.
