

CBP Directive No. 2130-030, Prevention, Detection and Response to Sexual Abuse and/or Assault in CBP Holding Facilities

This memorandum serves to inform the field that the Office of the Commissioner has issued CBP Directive No. 2130-030, Prevention, Detection and Response to Sexual Abuse and/or Assault in CBP Holding Facilities. This internal policy document memorializes CBP's implementation efforts of the DHS Standards to Prevent, Detect, and Respond to Sexual Abuse and Assault in Confinement Facilities (March 7, 2014), also found in 6 CFR Part 115. CBP Directive No. 2130-030 is consistent with existing OFO supplementary guidance "Standards to Prevent, Detect, and Respond to Sexual Abuse and Assault in CBP Holding Facilities" issued August 12, 2014.

It is critical that CBP Officers are taking appropriate measures to protect the health, welfare, security, and safety of any individual in our custody. Any allegations of sexual abuse and/or assault of a detainee must be accepted and promptly reported in a Significant Incident Report to the Commissioner's Situation Room and the Joint Intake Center. All OFO employees will cooperate fully with investigations relating to allegations of sexual abuse and/or assault of detainees and will take appropriate corrective actions, in coordination with OFO headquarters' sexual abuse incident review.
