Update to the Ombudsman's Alert: USCIS Implements its Inadmissibility on Public Charge Grounds Final Rule

On February 22, 2020, USCIS announced that the Supreme Court had lifted the statewide injunction issued by the U.S. District Court for the Northern District of Illinois. The District Court's ruling affected Illinois filers. On February 24, 2020, USCIS will implement its <u>Inadmissibility on Public Charge Grounds Final Rule</u> nationwide, including in the state of Illinois. Due to litigation-related delays, USCIS will not consider the receipt of any public benefits received before February 24, 2020.

Certain classes of individuals will remain exempt from the public charge ground of inadmissibility (such as refugees, asylees, certain VAWA self-petitioners, U petitioners, AILA Doc. No. 20021840. (Posted 2/27/20)

and T applicants) and therefore, are not subject to the Final Rule.

Applicants and petitioners must use the updated forms posted on USCIS' website starting on February 24, 2020. USCIS will reject any petition or application that does not adhere to the rule, including those for Illinois filers on or after February 24, 2020.
