 Humanitarian WASHINGTON - U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services announced today that eligible Haitian Media Contacts nationals in the United States may begin the application process for Temporary Protected Status. Details and procedures for applying for TPS are provided in the Federal Register notice published Adoption Members of the Military & Their Families Outstanding Americans by Choice On Jan. 15, 2010, Secretary of Homeland Security Janet Napolitano designated TPS for eligible Haitian nationals as a result of the catastrophic earthquake that occurred in Haiti on Jan. 12, Add Our RSS Feed Share This Page The TPS designation for Haiti is effective today and will remain in effect through July 22, 2011. The designation means that eligible Haitian nationals will not be removed from the United States and will also be eligible to apply to work in the United States. The 180-day registration period for Get E-mail Updates eligible Haitian nationals to apply for TPS begins today and will end on July 20, 2010. The designation applies only to those Haitians who resided in the United States on or before Jan. 12, 2010; TPS will not be granted to Haitian nationals who entered the United States after Jan. 12, 2010. Haiti joins El Salvador, Honduras, Nicaragua, Somalia, and Sudan as countries currently designated for TPS. Last updated:01/21/2010
