What is the EOIR Courts & Appeals System (ECAS)?



The EOIR Courts & Appeals System (ECAS) initiative is part of an overarching information technology modernization effort at EOIR. The goal of ECAS is to phase out paper filing and processing, and to retain all records and case-related documents in electronic format. ECAS is comprised of specialized applications and tools. In support of the EOIR mission, it will further enable the timely, fair, and uniform adjudication of immigration cases.

Electronic Record of Proceedings (eROP)

A cloud-based electronic repository containing all immigration case-related documents. These documents are acquired through eInfo and eFiling, and are accessible EOIR-wide and to external users as requested.

Judicial Tools

An online dashboard that allows users to access case details, review documents in the eROP, make annotations on documents, view the docket, and create orders and decisions.

Case Access System for EOIR (CASE)
eWorld-CASE
EOIR's current case tracking and management system.

***NEW Case Management System (CMS)**

Replaces the current CASE system with enhanced functionality to ultimately manage the lifecycle of all immigration cases.

eRegistry

Allows attorneys, accredited representatives, and DHS representatives to register for access to eInfo, eFiling, and the DHS Portal.

eFiling

Allows registered users to complete and file the EOIR-27 and EOIR-28 forms.

eInfo

Allows registered attorneys and accredited representatives to view their case details, upload initiating and supporting documents, and request/download an eROP. These documents are stored in an eROP.

DHS Portal

Allows registered DHS staff to upload initiating and supporting documents and request/download an eROP.
