

Amendment to the Follow up Guidance for Photo Comparison

during Inspection Muster

The Admissibility and Passenger Programs within the Office of Field Operations (OFO) recently issued a muster "Follow up Guidance for Photo Comparison during Inspection" which mandated CBP officers to follow the specific steps to identify impostors attempting entry to the United States. The purpose of this memorandum is to clarify the previously issued muster and provide tools to utilize in the detection of imposters to travel documents at primary inspection booths.



It is critical for the security of the United States that CBP officers diligently utilize consistent techniques in the detection of imposters for all arriving travelers. Directors, Field Operations; Port Directors; CBP managers, supervisors, and officers are all responsible to ensure that the CBP mission to prevent the travel of malafide travelers is executed.



Recently, the Office of Field Operations (OFO) disseminated a memorandum and muster entitled "Mandatory Requirement for Photo Comparison during Inspection". This follow up muster is intended to provide step by step guidance utilizing a systematic approach for (b) (7)(E)

It is critical

that officers consistently follow the mandatory inspection steps to ensure that OFO is able to carry out our mission to prevent inadmissible travelers from entering the United States.

CBP officers will be required to follow the specific steps listed below in order to identify impostors attempting entry to the United States:



The above mandatory impostor detection steps will be required elements for every inspection conducted by CBP officers. Those officers assigned to NEXUS, SENTRI, and FAST lanes will continue to inspect passport or other acceptable travel documents and will be required to utilize the same impostor detection steps listed above. CBP personnel posted at egress areas will be required to follow the same procedures when encountering Global Entry travelers exiting the Federal Inspection Services (FIS) area.

CBP supervisors and managers are required to ensure that CBP officers are accomplishing the necessary steps to allow the detection of all travelers who are impostors to the documents they are presenting. As previously stated, failure to follow the mandatory impostor detection steps will be immediately addressed by management and may result in disciplinary action.


