On Sept. 10, U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services will continue our Tech Talk series on the Keeping Families Together process. During this engagement, we will review common questions related to preparing and filing [Form I-131F, Application for Parole in Place for Certain Noncitizen Spouses and Stepchildren of U.S. Citizens](#), through a [USCIS online account](#). We will also respond to stakeholders' questions.

ALERT: On Aug. 26, 2024, the United States District Court for the Eastern District of Texas, in *Texas v. Department of Homeland Security*, Case Number 24-cv-306 administratively stayed the Department of Homeland Security from granting parole in place under Keeping Families Together for 14 days; the District Court might extend the period of this administrative stay.

While the process is administratively stayed, we will:

- Not grant any pending parole in place requests under Keeping Families Together.
- Continue to accept filings of Form I-131F, Application for Parole in Place for Certain Noncitizen Spouses and Stepchildren of U.S. Citizens.
- Continue to schedule biometric appointments at Application Support Centers (ASCs).

The District Court’s administrative stay order does not affect any applications that were approved before the administrative stay order was issued.
