Office of Community Engagement

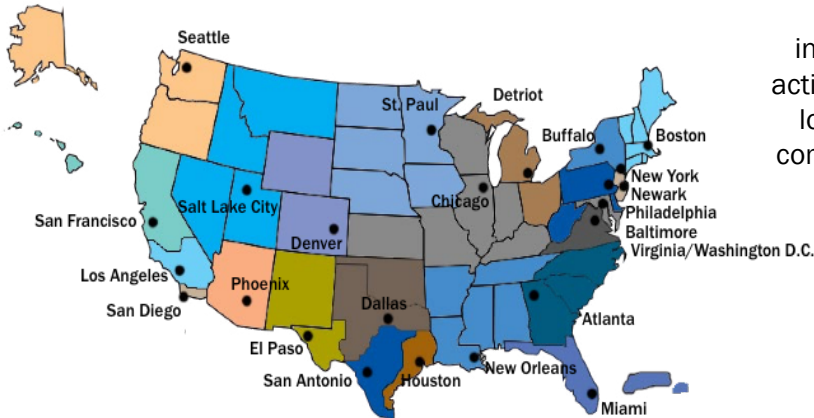
