Procedures for Air Travelers

U.S. Customs and Border Protection (CBP) implemented Western Hemisphere Travel Initiative (WHTI) document requirements for international air travelers on January 23, 2007. Since that date, citizens of the United States, Canada, Mexico and Bermuda have been required to present a passport or other acceptable travel document when arriving into the United States by air. CBP implemented an "informed compliance" phased enforcement strategy, which transitioned to full enforcement on February 19, 2008.

This memorandum serves as an update and reminder of the proper procedures for processing noncompliant travelers in the air environment.

WHTI-compliant documents for air travel include:

- Valid passport
- U.S. military identification card with official orders
- NEXUS card (when departing from specific Canadian airports)
- Merchant Mariner's Document (for U.S. citizens on official maritime business)





Additional Considerations:

Requirements for Lawful Permanent Residents (LPRs) are not affected by WHTI. LPRs must continue to present a valid Permanent Resident Card (I-55l). A passport is not required. Parolees, asylees, refugees, and those presenting boarding letters are also not affected by WHTI.








Western Hemisphere Travel Initiative (WHTI) Air
