SUBJECT:	Updated Processing of Initial Refugees Arrivals

As part of an ongoing effort to streamline the initial refugee admission process, CBP has been working with U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services (USCIS) and the U.S. Department of State (DOS) to transition to a more efficient overall process. Part of this effort involves relieving CBP of the administrative tasks surrounding the mailing of refugee packets to USCIS' Nebraska Service Centers for further processing. Effective April 22, 2016, CBP will no longer handle the mailing of refugee packets.



(b) (f)(E) If admissible, CBP Officers will admit the refugee accordingly in (e)(f)(E) and return all documents to the International Organization for Migration (IOM) representative that is escorting the refugee.

IOM representatives will then be responsible to prepare the refugee packet for mailing to the USCIS Nebraska Service Center and drop off in the location designated for mail pickup within the Federal Inspection Service (FIS) area. Mailing costs will be transferred to CIS in the near future, however, in the interim CBP Ports of Entry must continue to supply needed mailing materials (e.g. boxes, mailing labels) to IOM during this transition period. Ports of Entry should continue to communicate and work in partnership with IOM locally.
